4th Quarter

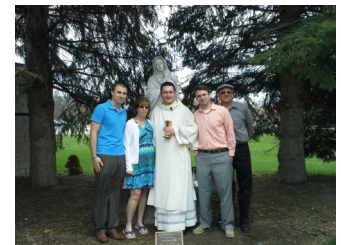
As we finish up our last quarter in the Fraternal Year, I took a look back at some of your Council's accomplishments.
